Message from Fr Paul O'Neill

My dear sister and brothers, it is good to be back with you after my holidays. I had a restful time with my family and friends. On the 20th of August, I celebrated my 41st ordination anniversary as a priest of this diocese. My life has been enriched by the many parish communities I have been able to serve. Thank you.

One of the saddest realities we have had to face over the past 20 or so years, is the realisation of the devastation and damage that has been done to victims of child sexual abuse. The church of our diocese, now has a well-known and shameful criminal history of child sexual abuse amongst both clergy and other church personnel. This has been at the forefront of the regions media for some time with both the special commission of inquiry into matters relating to police investigation or certain child sexual abuse allegations, and the ongoing royal commission into institutional responses to child sexual abuse, through which this diocese criminal history has again been brought to light.

Lina, a victim of child sexual abuse at the hands of a member of clergy in the Catholic Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle has conceived a project of atonement that is being facilitated by the diocese. Lina's hope is that this event will provide some healing for the whole community.

The event will take place on Friday 15th September at Newcastle city hall, concert hall from 5.30pm - 7.30pm. All clergy and parishioners of our diocese are invited to this event. People can reply on Lina's project website www.linasproject.com.au. A reply is requested for catering purposes though personal details are not required for this rsvp. You may choose to share your first name only or register anonymously.

I invite all our parishioners to give prayerful consideration to this invitation and join me at this event in Newcastle on Friday 15th September. Let us continue to work together and pray for healing for survivors of sexual abuse and an ongoing commitment to keep safe the children of our communities.

St Vincent de Paul Society NSW/ACT good works

A CALL TO HOLINESS

The Rule of the Society states that "The vocation of the Society's members, who are called Vincentians, is to follow Christ through service to those in need and so bear witness to His compassionate and liberating love. While reaching out to the vulnerable in society, nevertheless the Society is much more that a welfare organization. As the Rule also states:

Vincentians are called *to journey together towards holiness*, because true holiness is perfect union with Christ and the perfection of love. They draw nearer to Christ through a life of prayer and reflection, both at the individual and community level, and sharing with their fellow members.



An opportunity for prayer and reflection, and to share their beliefs, was afforded to members recently. Fr Greg Barker ran a day in which he encouraged members to respond to Jesus' message in a number of gospel passages, and to consider what implications there might be for us as Vincentians.

Members were challenged to review their work as Vincentians and to strive, as the Society's founder Frederic Ozanam did, "to attain holiness as a lay person through living the Gospel fully in all aspects of life."

The Society is always ready to welcome new members, providing them with the opportunity to not only reach out to the poor, but also to share with one another and to support one another in a *journey together towards holiness*.



Stories from the front-line of inequality, 2015. St Vincent de Paul Society - National Council Australia

For some years John Sheridan has been a volunteer to the East Maitland conference of St Vincent de Paul Society. John will be contributing to the Chisholm Connection to help us understand what it means to be living in the streets with nowhere to go. These stories are also published in the Society's journal and are freely available to the public.

Eighteen months ago, when Monash Medical restructured its admin section after funding cuts from the government, Maria's job disappeared and she was laid off.

Maria tried desperately to find work, but was unsuccessful. Being over 55, Maria was able to access her \$9000 superannuation fund. She used it to supplement her unemployment benefits, but in July 2014 it was exhausted

Maria has nothing. Her only income is her government unemployment benefit of \$630 per fortnight. With only \$30 a fortnight left to live on, Maria is unable to pay for an internet or phone connection, so is cut off from the world and the job market.

She relies on charity for food. However, she is now unable to meet her rental and car payments. When her car is repossessed she will be cut off from her only means of potentially securing the employment she is so desperately seeking.

Maria faces imminent homelessness and absolute poverty, and there seems nothing she can do about it.

This could be you - it happens every day!



- The payment of the DFSBL is not eligible to be claimed as a tax deduction, as the levy is compulsory and not a voluntary contribution
- A percentage of the parent's contribution to the parish's planned giving program can be claimed as a tax deduction if no material advantage is received by the parents
- Material benefits to the parents would include a partial or full exemption from paying the DFSBL Therefore, if parents choose to contribute to their parish planned giving program, they will continue to receive an exemption from paying the DFSBL. However, those parents receiving the exemption are unable to claim a tax deduction for their contributions to the parish. EDITH STEIN - THE SEVENTH CHAMBER. A moving, artistic portrayal of the life of a Jewish philosopher, Catholic convert and Carmelite martyr Edith Stein. Capturing the interior struggles of this extraordinary woman, as well as the great conflicts from her decision to convert to Catholicism. Deeply influenced by the writings of St. Theresa of Avila after reading her



autobiography, she encounters the God of love. This love burns within her so much that she joins the Carmelites and takes the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. She was put to death in Auschwitz in 1942 and canonized by Pope St. John Paul II in 1998.

This film shows how two worlds were united within her, the Jew and the Christian, in absolute coherence in her search for truth. She has become one of the most beautiful symbols in a horrifying period of history who sought to transform her sufferings under the Nazis into a journey through the "interior castle" as the way to mystical union with God. One phrase, "Love Conquers Fear" embodies her philosophy of life.

Sister Benedicta's final work, "The Science of the Cross" was unfinished; it contained these words: "The nuptial union of the soul with God is the goal for which she was created; redeemed by the cross, accomplished on the cross, and for all eternity signed and sealed with the cross."

Pope St. John Paul II, a great admirer of Edith Stein, made this remark when beatifying Sister Benedicta in Cologne, Germany, on May I, 1987: "We bow down before the testimony of the life and death of Edith Stein, an outstanding daughter of Israel and at the same time a daughter of the Carmelite Order, Sister Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, a personality who united within her rich life a dramatic synthesis of our century. It was the synthesis of a history full of deep wounds that are still hurting.... and also the synthesis of the full truth about man. All this came together in a single heart that remained restless and unfulfilled until it finally found rest in God."

St. Benedicta of the Cross pray for us that we may be worthy of the promises of Christ.

Saints and Feasts in September 2017

8/9/17 NATIVITY of the BLESSED VIRGIN MARY is a feast that commemorates the birthday of Jesus' mother. Even though Mary's birth is not recorded in the scriptures, it is mentioned in the apocryphal writings from the century, second Protoevangelium of James and is even mentioned in Islamic scripture. Her parents are named as Saint Anne and Saint Joachim



and tradition places Mary's birthplace in Jerusalem. The feast has been celebrated since the fifth century - on 8th September in the Roman calendar.



9/9/17 ST PETER CLAVER was born in Spain in 1581AD. After studying at the university of Barcelona, he became a Jesuit at the age of 20. St Peter was influenced by St Alphonsus Rodriguez to become a missionary the Americas, where he ministered both physically and spiritually to the African slaves. He spent the next 40 years working for the humane treatment of slaves on plantations, and he reportedly

converted some 300,000 African slaves Christianity. Within the Spanish community living in America, St Peter organised charitable societies, similar to those organised by St Vincent de Paul across Europe. He said of the slaves, "We must speak to them with our hands by giving, before we try to speak to them with our lips."



Must Tonly Pame 12/9/17 The MOST HOLY NAME of MARY This feast day began in Spain in 1513. In Pope Innocent extended the existing Feast of the Most Holy Name of Mary to the universal Church to thank Our Lady for the victory of John Sobieski, king of Poland, over the forces of militant Islam. On September

11th, 1683, Muslim Turks attacked Vienna, threatening the Christian West. The next day, Sobieski, invoking the Blessed Virgin Mary and placing his forces under her protection, emerged victorious. Pope John Paul II restored the feast of the Holy Name of Mary with the publication of the Third Typical Edition of the Roman Missal in 2002, one year after the attacks of September 11th, 2001. In Hebrew, the name Mary is Miryam. In Our Lady's time, Aramaic was the spoken language, and the form of the name then was Mariam. Throughout the centuries, Saints and scholars have put forth different interpretations for the name "Mary" - a mixture of etymology and devotion. However Star of the Sea certainly seems most accepted. St Thomas Aquinas wrote;" Mary means star of the sea, for as mariners are guided to port by the ocean star, so Christians attaint to glory through Mary's maternal intercession."

13/9/17 ST JOHN CHRYSOSTOM was born in Antioch in 347 AD and was raised by his widowed mother. After receiving the best education available, he

became a monk and lived an austere life in the mountains. He returned to Antioch eight years later to become a deacon and eventually was ordained a priest in 386 AD. Št John became a famous preacher and commentator on the Gospels of Matthew and John and the Epistles of Paul. In 397 AD, **Emperor Arcadius chose St John** become the Archbishop of Constantinople. He was outspoken in his attempts to reform the



corrupt morals of the court, clergy and people. As a result of this he made many enemies, who conspired to have him removed as Archbishop and sent into exile. In the West he is known as one of the Four Greek Doctors of the church.

14/9/17 EXALTATION of the HOLY CROSS This Feast celebrates three historical events: the finding of the True Cross by Saint Helena, the mother of the emperor Constantine; the dedication of churches built by Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary; and the restoration of the True Cross to Jerusalem by the emperor Heraclius II. But in a deeper sense, the feast also celebrates the Holy Cross as the instrument of our salvation. This instrument of torture, designed to degrade the worst of criminals, became the life-giving tree that reversed Adam's Original Sin when he ate from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil in the Garden of Eden.

15/9/17 OUR SORROWS Devotion to the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady has its roots in Sacred Scripture and in Christian piety, which always associates the Blessed Mother with her suffering Son. Today's feast was introduced by the Servites in order to intensify devotion to Our Lady's Sorrows. In 1817 Pius VII suffering grievously in exile but



finally liberated by Mary's intercession — extended the feast to the universal Church. The title "Our Lady of Sorrows" focuses on Mary's intense suffering during the passion and death of Christ. "The Seven Dolors," the title by which it was celebrated in the 17th century, referred to the seven swords that pierced the Heart of Mary.



16/9/17 STS CORNELIUS, POPE, MARTYR, AND CYPRIAN, BISHOP, MARTYR was elected as pope in 251AD; a time when Christians were being persecuted. He faced much opposition within the church over the issue of reconciling those who had distanced themselves from the church (apostates) during these dangerous times. St Cyprian was the bishop of Carthage. He supported the pope's view that apostates should be pardoned and

welcomed back into the church. A few letters written by Cornelius to Cyprian survive today, including those which were written after he was banished from Rome in 253AD. Cornelius died in exile most probably from poor health, although it was Cyprian who called him a martyr to the faith.

Saints and Feasts in September 2017



20/9/17 STS ANDREW KIM TAE-GON PRIEST, PAUL CHONG HA-SANG, AND COMPANIONS, MARTYRS Christianity came to Korea in secret in the 17th century. The Korean government

did not allow Christians to practice their faith. Andrew Kim Taegon was the son of Korean parents who became Christians after hearing the Word of God. When Andrew was 15, his father was executed for being a follower of Jesus. The faith of his father and other brave Catholics inspired Andrew to become a priest, the first born in Korea. Andrew travelled 1,300 miles to the nearest seminary in faraway Macao, China. After six years of training, Andrew was ordained and returned to his country. The Korean Catholics were overjoyed to finally have a priest who could celebrate the sacraments with them. But in 1846, Father Taegon was arrested and put to death for his faith at the age of 25. Paul Chong Hasang was a catechist training him for the priesthood with Father Taegon. He, too, was captured and martyred. In all, 103 Catholics died for their faith between 1839 and 1867. They were young and old, men and women, peasants and wealthy people. Pope John Paul II travelled to Korea in 1984 and canonized these Martyrs of Korea. We honour their sacrifice. They help us to remember that faith is a virtue that makes it possible to know and believe in God. Their sacrifice also reminds us that we are blessed to live in a country where we are free to live our faith.

21/9/17 ST MATTHEW, APOSTLE was originally a tax collector for the Roman Government of Capernaum, before Jesus called him to become an apostle. Jesus' contemporaries were surprised to see him associating with someone like Matthew, but Jesus explained that he had come "not to call the just, but the sinners". In the Gospels of Mark and Luke, Matthew is called Levi, and so it is thought that he may have had both



names. The first Gospel was believed to have been written by Matthew. His account of Christ's life was written for his fellow Jews; to convince them that their anticipated Messiah had indeed come in the person of Jesus.



23/9/17 ST PIUS of PIETRELCINA, PRIEST - Francesco, named in honour of St. Francis of Assisi, was born to Giuseppa and Grazio Forgione, peasant farmers, in the small Italian village of Pietrelcina on May 25, 1887. From his childhood, it was evident that he was a special child of God. He became a Capuchin novice at the age of sixteen and

received the habit in 1902. Francesco was ordained to the priesthood in 1910 after seven years of study and became known as Padre Pio. On September 20, 1918, Padre Pio was kneeling in front of a large crucifix when he received the visible marks of the crucifixion, making him the first stigmatized priest in

the history of Church. Padre Pio had the ability to read the hearts of the penitents who flocked to him for confession which he heard for ten or twelve hours per day. Padre Pio used the confessional to bring both sinners and devout souls closer to God; he would know just the right word of counsel or encouragement that was needed. On June 16, 2002, Pope John Paul II proclaim Padre Pio, Saint Padre Pio of Pietrelcina.


27/9/17 ST VINCENT de PAUL was born to a French peasant family in 1580. He was a highly intelligent youth and was educated by the Franciscans for several years, before being ordained at the age of 20. In 1605 he was captured by Turkish pirates who sold him into slavery, but won his freedom after he converted one of his masters to Christianity. After returning to



France, he served as a parish priest near Paris and began to establish charitable organisations that helped the poor, nursed the sick and found work for the unemployed. St Vincent founded the Congregation of the Daughters of Charity with Louise de Marillac, and instituted the Congregation of Priests of the Mission, also known as the Lazarists. Today the Society of St Vincent de Paul provides relief to people in need across the world.

29/9/17 STS MICHAEL, GABRIEL, RAPHAEL, archangels.







St. Gabriel was the Angel who told Mary that she would be the Mother of the Savior; Patron of communications.



St. Raphael traveled with and guarded Tobiah in the O.T. book of *Tobit*; Patron of travelers.



30/9/17 ST JEROME, PRIEST, DOCTOR born Eusebius Hieronymous Sophronius, was the most learned of the Fathers of the Western Church. He is one of the four great Latin Doctors of the Church and is perhaps best known for his translation of the Hebrew

books of the Bible into Latin, termed as the Vulgate. He teaches us the wisdom of obedience to the Church's magisterial authority, and, certainly, to the supreme earthly authority of the Roman Pontiff, the Vicar of Christ. For St. Jerome frequently showed his reliance on the authority of the pope, as well as the extreme importance of the Magisterium (teaching office of the Church) for guidance on doctrinal matters.
